Why do we go to church? I remember asking my mother that question growing up and it was usually asked because I was hoping she wouldn't have an answer. I confess. I was looking for a way out.

We have all sorts of answers to that question. One answer I often hear is to learn about God. Another might be to give God our worship. In small towns like ours we might come to church, "because that is what we do on Sunday mornings." But really, why do we go to church?

Certainly learning takes place and hopefully it is about God. Knowing Scripture and the history of God's activity in the world is beneficial. This is why we have Sunday school and Confirmation and Bible Studies. We can also learn about God in the Sunday service, but that isn't its primary purpose.

Of course, worship takes place on Sunday mornings. We sing songs and give our morning offering because a healthy relationship (or even an unhealthy one for that matter) with God develops a desire to give. But I would also argue that this isn't the primary reason for coming to Sunday (or Wednesday) services.

The primary reason for why we come to church for Sunday service isn't because we have something to give to God, it is because God has something to give to us — and we are desperately in need of what he has to offer. We may enter the service with a song of praise, but usually we immediately enter into confession and it is after confession that we receive what God desires to give over and over again in the service — his forgiveness.

After confession we hear God's "I forgive you." I would also hope that in each and every one of my sermons you would also hear God's "I forgive you." When we celebrate Holy Communion, what is it that God gives us? His body given for you, his blood shed for you for the forgiveness of sin.

Why do we come to church? We come primarily to receive the benefits of Christ – his forgiveness and life. Sure we worship, we learn and we give a little back, but the quality of our worship doesn't depend on what we give, it depends solely on what God gives.
