May is here, which means Mother's Day approaches. Sons, daughters, husbands... you have been warned!

Mothers are amazing. Someone once told me to never start a fight with someone when their mother is present. Shakespeare had it right when he (kind of) said, "Hell hath no fury like that of a woman's scorn." More appropriately though, hell hath no fury like that of a *mother's* scorn. (I'm sure some of you farmers dealing with newborn calves this spring can relate.) Mothers are incredibly protective of their young and they will sacrifice everything for their children. God does this for us also.

Though in the Apostles Creed we rightly confess God to be "God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth," on more than one occasion in Scripture, motherly metaphors are used to describe God's protection over his children. Often this comes to us through the imagery of a mother bird watching over her young.

Consider Psalm 17:7-9, "Wondrously show your steadfast love, O Savior, of those who seek refuge from their adversaries at your right hand. Keep me as the apple of your eye; hide me in *the shadow of your wings*, from the wicked who do me violence, my deadly enemies who surround me." (Emphasis added.)

Psalm 57:1 follows this same line of thought, "Be merciful to me, O God, be merciful to me, for in you my soul takes refuge; in the shadow of your wings I will take refuge, till the storms of destruction pass by." (Emphasis added.)

Christ echoed similar sentiments when he looked out upon Jerusalem. Luke 13:34, "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you would not!"

As one baptized, you are washed of the guilt of your sin and claimed as a child of God. What a gift! As a child of God, you are the apple of the Lord's eye and you have refuge under his wings. Do not spurn these promises as Jerusalem did, but cling to them in faith.

HOW PERSONAL CARE KITS CAN BOOST SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

CHHEANG USOPHEA

FIFTEEN-YEAR-OLD CHHEANG USOPHEA IS A NINTH GRADER AT TONLE KRAU SECONDARY SCHOOL IN CAMBODIA. Because of the remote location of her village, Chheang has to travel 1.5 miles to school by foot or boat. This is particularly challenging during the rainy season. But some days it's not her long commute that

keeps her from school.

Chheang lives in an area where there's poor sanitation and barely any clean water. These poor conditions severely affect her ability to stay clean because she's only able to wash her school uniform and bathe a couple of times a week due to the scarcity of hygiene materials. Chheang, along with 157 other students, received LWR Personal Care Kits.

Chheang, feeling very excited, said, "I'm so enthusiastic about new Personal Care Kits ... Prior to having the Kit, I only had one torn towel that was used together by my whole family for taking a bath and

washing hands." Chheang is one of five children and explains that it's hard for her parents to provide education for all of the children and purchase hygiene necessities. Chheang explained, "... the items in the Kit will save expenses and also introduce habits of hygienic behaviors within my family members."

Mr. Keo Narin, Tonle Krau's school master, explains that, "The provision of [the] Personal Care Kit is essential not only to meet the basic needs of poor students in terms of improvement of hygiene practices such as hand washing habits, but also to promote higher attendance of students to the class."

Students were happy to receive their Personal Care Kits and say, "Thank you LWR. We are very proud to receive the Kits."

Thank you to all the congregations who work so hard to extend these gifts of love to communities living in poverty around the world! ■

PARTNERSHIP-

To partner with other ministries both Ethiopian and International. We will be working with orphans and vulnerable women & children in cooperation with these local ministries. These partnerships will include projects like:

- Providence Guest House (PGH): Through PGH, we are working with local staff to set up a missionary base for those wishing to serve the lord through the own ministry organizations. Many people wish to serve but find that the cost of doing so is a major road block. That is where PGH comes in!! We offer long term stay for missionaries at a very reasonable, reduced rate. - Jemo Children's Hope Chest Ethiopia: We will be working alongside local staff in an area called Jemo, an overpopulated slum in Addis Ababa. One way, is by teaching english to students in the area. Many of the inhabitants in the area are uneducated and impoverished daily laborers who have no reliable income to support their families. Currently, there are over 200 destitute children in the community. Many parents and caregivers are unable to afford to send all of their children to school, and as result the cycle of poverty continues. We want the children of Jemo to have the opportunity to grow physically, medically, educationally, spiritually, and emotionally!
- Partner with existing Orphanges and drop-in centers supporting children's medical, physical, educational, emotional, and spiritual needs.

Ethiopia

Ethiopia is a country plagued by years of war, severe drought, epidemics, and crippled economically and socially. Ethiopia is also Africa's oldest and second most populated country.

One in ten children die before their first birthday.

• One in six children die before their fifth birthday.

• 60% of children in Ethiopia are stunted because of malnutrition.

1.5 million people in Ethiopia are infected with HIV (6th highest country in the world).
 720,00 children have been orphaned by AIDs alone, and there are 5 million orphans.

Half the children in Ethiopia will never attend school. 88% will never attend secondary school.

Ethiopia's doctor to children ratio is 1 to 24,000.
