Last year in my article for the August newsletter, I wrote that plans were coming together on a multigenerational mission trip to one of three locations. And now while Brenda compiles this newsletter and prepares it for mailing, I (and 19 others) find ourselves in Sault STE Marie, Michigan on a mission trip. Soon you will hear reports of this trip, but perhaps for now it would be good to consider why mission trips and mission in general are good and important for the church.

First and foremost is, of course, the command of Christ. We are given this command from Christ in Matthew 28:18-20, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." We are commanded to proclaim Christ. The Lord chooses to work through those he has redeemed when it comes to proclaiming salvation in his name. It doesn't always seem like a good plan, but hopefully in our weaknesses God will be shown to be full of power and mercy.

Christ showed mercy to many throughout the Gospels. He healed people and fed them simply because he is merciful and caring. The miracles he did displayed God's care for the world (not to mention the power and authority of Christ.) Often in mission work, we show God's care for the world by serving others. At the time I am writing this, I don't yet know what we will do in Michigan, but my guess is that most of what will be done will be service to those in need. My prayer is that our good deeds will represent Christ to those we serve.

The proclamation of Christ and the call to serve our neighbors is the call of the church. This is our mission. But one reason mission *trips* are good for the local church is that they do a lot of good for those who do the serving and proclaiming. My experience is that when a group like ours goes out to serve others, the group often returns with a better sense of who they are and what the rest of the world looks like. They return more cohesive and the common purpose of the church is strengthened. In serving others, the group and the individual who does the serving benefits greatly.

Because of both our call and the benefit it is for our own souls, I hope to have many more mission trips in our future.

Children's HopeChest and Bismarck Community Church's Sister Church

Children's HopeChest exists to glorify God by releasing the potential of orphaned and vulnerable children and their communities through partnerships that cultivate holistic transformation and sustainability.

Children's HopeChest helps to meet medical, physical, educational,



emotional, and spiritual needs of orphaned children and youth, in Russia, Swaziland, Ethiopia, Uganda, Haiti, Guatemala, Moldova, India, and the United States.

Bismarck Community Church has partnered with HopeChest by adopting the congregation in Jemo, Ethiopia. **Our giving will help support BCC's partnership with the Jemo Congregation.** Jemo Mekane Yesus Congregation was established in 2000 and has grown to nearly 500 members that consist of two ordained ministers and over 50 volunteers who serve the church and the surrounding community. The church congregation and leadership have a good standing relationship the local government and other authorities who are involved in both developmental and community matters in the vicinity.

Jemo is located in an overpopulated slum where most of the houses are not conducive to for living. The environment surrounding the Jemo CarePoint is very damaged and corroded due to practices related to mining natural resources. The techniques used to mine these resources include detonating explosives and other harmful methods.

Many of the inhabitants in the area are uneducated and impoverished daily laborers who have no reliable income to support their families. Currently, there are over 200 destitute children in the community. Among these, 60 percent of the children are attending classes at a nearby government school; however many parents and caregivers are unable to afford to send all of their children to school, and as result the cycle of poverty continues. Jemo Church operates as a drop-in center, a safe place where needy children can come for care and support. With your support, the children at Jemo will have the opportunity to grow physically, medically, educationally, spiritually, and emotionally.

Bismarck Community Church has partnered with Jemo in multiple ways. They are currently sponsoring 200 children with \$38/month to fund things like education, nutrition, and health care. Their funding also helps to provide needed infrastructure and income generating opportunities for the adults in the community.
