LCMC Annual Gathering Service Project

For the past two LCMC Annual Gatherings, a service project has been added to the agenda. In Des Moines 2014, almost 300,000 meals were packaged for "Meals from the Heartland" and over \$90,000 was raised to do so. Last year, just over 160 pints of blood were donated to a local blood bank in Dallas, Texas.

This year, the LCMC is working with Lutheran World Relief (LWR), one of the most efficient and effective relief agencies in the world, to help assemble personal care kits for people around the world whose lives have been affected by natural disasters.

The goal for 2016 is to have the participants at this year's Annual Gathering in Denver, CO assemble 10,000 personal care kits. In order to make this happen, about \$50,000 in special offerings from the congregations of LCMC will need to be raised.

All donations received will go towards purchasing supplies for these kits!


Mission of the Month: Lutheran World Relief
