For better or worse, Anne and I took upon ourselves the challenge of writing this year's Vacation Bible School curriculum. As such, I am fairly equipped to give you a preview. This year's Vacation Bible School (June 6-8 from 5:30-8:00 pm) will focus primarily on God's Promises. It will feature puppet shows, skits, and three Bible studies.

The first lesson is titled, "God Hears Us." Using the passage from Exodus 3 when God speaks to Moses through the burning bush, the children will learn about the plight of the Israelites while they were in slavery in Egypt. God tells Moses that he sees, hears, and knows the suffering of his people. What's more is that he plans to do something about it! God promises to rescue them and to bring them to a land just for them.

In the second lesson, "God Keeps His Promise," we'll learn that about how God kept his promise to rescue his people from slavery in Egypt. The story we'll study in particular is of the crossing of the Red Sea when the Israelites were trapped between the sea and the Egyptian army. They were frightened, discouraged, and distraught. But Moses encouraged them by saying, "Don't be afraid! Be brave, and you will see the Lord save you today. These Egyptians will never bother you again. The Lord will fight for you, and you won't have to do a thing." The Lord promised to rescue the people from slavery and he did!

In the last lesson we leave Egypt and the Old Testament and head to the cross. The focus for this lesson ("Jesus Rescues Us") comes from Romans 10:13, "For 'everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." It takes the themes from our first and second lesson and applies them directly to what Christ did for us through his cross. We'll look at the passage from Luke 23 when Christ is crucified alongside two criminals. While one thief ridicules Christ, another recognizes him for who he is. He calls out to Jesus, "Remember me when you come into power!" Jesus sees, hears, and knows him. Jesus gives him the promise, "Today, you will be with me in paradise."

Vacation Bible School will be a great time! I've had a lot of fun writing the lessons and everything else. Please send your children and grandchildren for a great time.
