Recently, I read about how Martin Luther read through the Bible twice a year throughout most of his life. I also read about how Luther would often recite to himself the Apostles Creed, the Ten Commandments, and the Lord's Prayer. Even though he knew sacred Scripture inside and out and even though he was the one who actually wrote the Large and Small Catechisms, he still forced himself to approach the Scriptures as a student rather than as a teacher.

I am humbled by Martin Luther's discipline and approach. My own habits fall far short of his and probably fall far short of many others — and I'm a pastor! So inspired by Dr. Luther, I am going to try and do better at consistently reading the Scriptures each day and I challenge you to do the same.

There are many resources online to give you direction for a reading plan of Scripture. Biblegateway.com is an excellent resource and has many plans as does the website http://www.ligonier.org/blog/bible-reading-plans/. For smart phone and tablet users, the Bible app and the Sola app (as in Sola Publishing) are great options. The Sola app also provides access to the Small Catechism and devotions using the Lutheran Confessions.

For those less tech savvy, it may be that your own Bible has a reading plan included in its front or back pages. There are also many books out there that lay out the Scriptures in an easier way to read on a more regular and devotional basis. One I like is The Treasury of Daily Prayer from Concordia Publishing House. If you don't have access to these, I would be happy to find one online for you and print one out for you.

Since the beginning of the school year always feels more like the beginning of a new year than New Year's itself does, this is a great time to begin a reading plan. May God bless you as you are fed by his Most Holy Word.



August Mission of the Month: The Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission

More than fifty years ago Lutheran Christian missionaries arrived in Rock Point, AZ, a remote, isolated village near the Four Corners area where Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado and Utah meet. They were leased 5 acres of land on which to build the Mission.

The Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission (NELM) exists today to connect diverse communities to the needs of the Navajo People by creating a safe environment where the values of education, culture,



and spiritual formation are accessible to all people.

According to their core values followers of Christ, NELM strives for reconciliation and healing in a broken world. They work for justice and peace, in accordance with the teachings of Jesus, in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Other values include:

- Serving and supporting the community through cultural sensitivity, open communication, and love for all.
- Applying the highest level of ethical standards by being financially and morally accountable to all.
- Providing the best possible education and community services in an efficient and effective manner.
- Working with the Rock Point community to assist residents in creating a socially and economically sustainable community.

Core Beliefs include:

- We believe that all people are children of God.
- We believe that the Navajo People are our sisters and brothers; our neighbors.
- We believe that when our neighbors hurt, we hurt, and we are led to care.
- We believe that service grows out of community, and we are committed to partnership with the Navajo People in that ministry of service.
