This fall, Adult Bible Study will be resuming on Sunday mornings with a series on the Gospel of Mark. The plan is to work our way through the entirety of Mark over the course of the year (or more). The Gospel of Mark is the shortest of the four Gospels and is often criticized for its brevity, but there are some very powerful themes within this short Gospel and we will be richly blessed by studying it.

One of Mark's points of emphasis is the authority and power of Christ. In Mark, when Jesus speaks people and demons listen. Nature, disease, and the stuff of creation listen as well for when Jesus speaks, his power pours forth. There are many miracles in Mark's short Gospel putting the power of Jesus the Son of God (another theme of Mark) on full display. However, in Mark, Jesus is also shown to be as fully human as he is fully divine. He openly shows his anger, compassion, and frustration. At times he betrays a limited knowledge about certain events. In Mark, Jesus depends on prayer, becomes weary, and even feels the need for sleep. The power of Christ in his divinity and the humble nature of Christ in his humanity should be a great source of comfort to us.

The disciples in Mark should also comfort us, if for no other reason that they are anything but superheroes of the faith. Though they follow Jesus in faith and have their good moments, they frequently exhibit fear, a lack of faith, hardheartedness, a lack of understanding, and even cowardice. In other words, they are exactly like you and me!

Please feel free and comfortable to join in on Adult Bible Study, Sunday mornings during the Sunday School hour. There is no pressure to be a vocal participant. Many sit and simply listen to the conversation. Neither is there a pressure to attend every session. Though the study will be a continuous journey through Mark, each section stands well enough on its own making it easy to jump in after missing a Sunday or two.

So please come on Sunday mornings, for Bible study and for worship. Both are better with you there!

Peace Lutheran Church August Mission of the Month Charles Hall Youth Services



The mission of Charles Hall Youth Services

To assist at-risk youth in making a successful transition from troubled adolescence to mature adulthood. Our goal is for today's atrisk teens to discover their innate strengths, develop important life skills, and become emotionally resilient so that tomorrow's generation of youth live in healthier families with viable community supports.

Youth of CHYS, ages 10 to 19, have been adjudicated into the foster care system for a variety of reasons. Many of our youth come from families which are unable or unwilling to provide adequate care for their teenagers. Still others are court-ordered to us due to drug or alcohol abuse, truancies, run-away charges, or charges of delinquency or unruliness. Many youth struggle with post-traumatic stress (triggered by some horrific act which happened to them when they were younger), mental illnesses (especially depression and anxiety), or attention deficit disorder. Many struggle with thoughts of suicide, eating disorders, and/or other self-destructive acts. Charles Hall Youth Services serves approximately 90 youth each year.

Charles Hall Youth Services believes that:


- 1. Youth come to us with innate strengths and unique gifts that can be identified, nurtured, and built upon;
- 2. The self-worth of an individual is one of the most critical psychological human needs;
- 3. The mistakes of youth create some of the best opportunities for them to learn and grow;
- 4. Youth have the capacity and the responsibility to take an active role in their own social, emotional, moral, physical, and spiritual growth; and,
- 5. Youth have individual personalities, needs, and learning styles that should be taken into account when issues are addressed.

Charles Hall Youth Services programming:

- 1. Develops resilience and coping skills with foster-care youth in order to help them navigate the challenges in their everyday lives;
- 2. Supports youth in being able to deal with the stresses in their lives that have been unmanageable in the past, and in being able to make positive choices in the future; and,
- 3. Teaches the attitudes and skills that foster a fundamental sense of self-respect in each and every youth served.
