I don't know why, but I really like endowment funds. Park River Bible Camp has one and I always enjoyed watching it grow and seeing the interest dispersed. To me, there is no better way to memorialize someone than with a donation to a fund that is intended to be there for the life of the ministry.

Recently, there has been some confusion as to the purpose of the PLC Endowment Fund. Hopefully, this article will clarify the fund's purpose. First off, an Endowment Fund is an everlasting fund from which only the earnings are distributed. A gift given to the Endowment Fund remains in the fund forever to be wisely invested by the Endowment Fund Committee. The interest earned is then distributed by the Committee or reinvested into the Fund.

The Endowment Fund is not intended to be a "safety net" for the church and frankly, the church shouldn't need a safety net. Rather, it is intended to be a vehicle to fund missions, benefit our community, purchase equipment, and aid capital improvement campaigns and/or building programs of Peace Lutheran Church. In fact, the PLC bylaws specifically say that,

"Income from the Fund shall be distributed annually and at such other times as deemed necessary and/or feasible to accomplish the following purposes: 1) A minimum of 20% for outreach into the community, 2) a minimum of 20% for missions, 3) a minimum of 20% for equipment, capital improvement, debt reduction, or a building program of Peace Lutheran Church, 4) up to 40% for any one or all of the above designated areas in any proportion as determined by the Committee, or for causes and programs, which... are consistent with the Fund purpose of enhancing the mission outreach of Peace Lutheran Church."

It is exciting that the fund has finally reached its goal of having \$25,000 (and counting) in principle. Interest earned from this principle is now being put to use and as the principle grows through gifts and memorials, the interest and the fund's reach will also grow! May God continue to grant wisdom to the Endowment Fund Committee as they manage this fund all for the glory of God our Father.

October Mission of the Month Youthworks – Bismarck, ND

Youthworks is a private, 501(c)3 nonprofit agency with a Board of Directors. The agency was established in 1979 as Mountain Plains Youth Services Coalition and has been providing direct services since 1986 in Bismarck and 1991 in Fargo. Our offices are located in Bismarck and Fargo and we serve the surrounding counties in both North Dakota and Minnesota. Our focus and expertise is in working with teens, parents and young adults under 22 years of age. Most of the services are free and when there is a charge it is based on a family's ability to pay.



Our support comes from a variety of sources including units of government (state, city, county, and Federal), foundations, fees, schools, courts, and local fundraising. United Way provides funding for some of Youthworks' programs in both Bismarck-Mandan and Fargo-Moorhead. Contributions to Youthworks are tax deductible.

OUR SERVICES INCLUDE: programs for runaway, homeless and street youth; juvenile offenders; youth failing in school; youth suspended or expelled from school; young parents and pregnant moms (under 22); youth arrested and unable to immediately return home; youth needing emergency care: youth needing peer support or cross-age mentoring; and youth with anger issues. We provide family counseling during the day and in the evening at the convenience of the parents.

Youthworks AmeriCorps program provides college students with training and experience in working with youth and Youthworks also trains high school students in providing peer support.
