Some Scattered Thoughts on Thanksgiving

During this month of Thanksgiving we are reminded by our nation, the media, and the culture at large to give thanks. But as our world grows more and more secular, we aren't often told to whom we are to give thanks.

Psalm 106:1a, however, states it quite clearly. "Praise the LORD! Oh give thanks to the LORD." The second half of the verse continues, then, by stating why we give thanks to the Lord, "For he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever!" Giving thanks and praise to God is a sentiment that is repeated in some form or another quite often in the psalms and other places in Scripture. Our Lord is good. He is steadfast in his love for us. It is to him that our thanks are due because it is our Lord who has given us so much. James 1:17 affirms this. "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change."

One of the beautiful features of the Psalms of Thanksgiving (like Psalm 106) is that they not only voice our thanks to the Lord, they also voice our continuing need of God's blessing with the hope and faith that God will meet that need. Psalms of Thanksgiving are psalms of faith and hope because whatever request brought before God is based on how God has already blessed us and provided for us in the past. Philippians 4:4-6 follows this by putting both thanksgiving and request (supplication) together. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God."

As you seek the Lord for all that you need, remember to give thanks for what God has already blessed you with. And as you give thanks to God for what he has given you, do not be shy in praying that God would continue to bless you. Pray that God would be as faithful now as he has been in the past. The Lord wants you to come to him with your thanks and your requests.



Great Plains Food Bank

About GPFB: The Great Plains Food Bank's mission is to end hunger in North Dakota and western Minnesota through community partnerships. We are the largest hunger-relief organization in North Dakota and serve as its only food bank. Each year, we touch the lives of one in 9 individuals who seek emergency food assistance.

What GPFB Does: We strive to end hunger effectively and efficiently where waste is unacceptable. This



means working with a wide array of individuals and organizations on a daily basis, carefully guiding all donated surplus food and grocery products to our network of food pantries, soup kitchens, emergency shelters and other charitable feeding programs serving those who are hungry and homeless. As stewards of community support, we direct 96% of every charitable dollar received toward programs and services, ensuring food for three meals gets into the hands of those who are hungry.

How GPFB Does It: Community partners are imperative to our work in ending hunger. We work with hundreds of food industry donors and charitable feeding programs, and thousands of volunteers and financial supporters. Together we are creating hunger-free communities. Operations are based out of our 36,000 square foot statewide distribution facility and supported by a fleet of refrigerated trucks that travel half a million miles each year crisscrossing the state picking up and delivering shelf-stable and perishable food donations to those in need.
