Three Days of Prayer

I like what the LCMC (Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ) says about prayer.

"Our attitude toward prayer has often been characterized by saying, 'well, all we can do now is pray!' Prayer is not the hopeless act of desperation. Prayer is a gift that God has given to us as a means to approach the throne of grace with confidence—like that of a child coming to her parents sharing concerns, victories, defeats and every part of life. It is an opportunity to express the deepest heartache and the greatest joy. Prayer is a conversation between the Creator and the created...and the conversation began with God, for us, in Christ Jesus."

Let's start the new year with prayer! On January 2, 3, and 4 churches throughout the LCMC will be taking part in the LCMC's Annual Three Days of Prayer.

Each of the three days has a different prayer focus. Day one is focused on confession, day two is focused on petition (praying for our needs and the needs of others), and day three is focused on vision (praying for the Spirit's guidance). Though for most of the three days of prayer, we will participate as individuals, on day two (Wednesday, January 3rd), everyone is invited to attend a simple evening prayer service at Peace Lutheran at 7:00 PM.

Prayer is important. I hope that you will take part in the three days of prayer. Included in this newsletter is a guide for you to use during the three days of prayer.

From Purple to Blue

This year you'll notice a different color in the church during Advent. In the past, the paraments (the cloths that hang from the altar, lectern, and pulpit) have been purple during Advent. Purple, which also shows up during Lent, is the color of repentance as well and royalty. Purple has often been displayed during Lent and Advent in order to encourage us to reflect on the kingship of Christ and also on our own sin and need. So why the switch to blue?

Certainly the kingship of Christ is important during Advent. Also important is the reminder that we are sinful human beings. But Advent is also the season of hope. During Advent we look forward not just to the birth of Christ, we also look forward to the return of Christ. At Christ's return this world will finally be done with sin and corruption and all will be made new. This is when "the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings." (Malachi 4:2). And so, just as the sky is a deep shade of blue in the last hours before the sunrise, so now are our Advent paraments. The color is to remind us of the long awaited break of day – the promised of return of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Three Days of Prayer – A Guide

Lutherans throughout the LCMC will be beginning their new year in prayer. You are invited to join your fellow Lutherans on January 2nd, 3rd, and 4th. Each day has its own focus. Below is a description of each day along with passages from Scripture pertaining to each day's focus. As you read the passages, ask God to help you understand them and bring your prayers of confession, your prayers of petition, and your prayers for vision to the Lord.

The focus of January 2nd is CONFESSION.

"We have made our lives, our relationships—and even the church—in our own image. We confess that the church belongs to Jesus and not to us. We gather to lay down our pride, our sin and our agenda and ask the Lord of the church for forgiveness, which He gives freely and mercifully."

Suggested Readings: Psalm 51; 1 John 1:1-10; Colossians 1:11-14; Luther's Small Catechism on Confession

The focus on January 3rd is PETITION.

"Pray for your congregation, for the pastor, for the leaders, for those who carry out ministries, for the Sunday School teachers, for the Confirmation leaders, for those leading adult Bible studies and for those leading small groups. Pray for those in hospital and nursing home ministries. Pray for all those connected and not connected to your church that they might know God's redeeming love for all in Christ."

Suggested Readings: Philippians 4:4-6; 1 Timothy 2:1-6; The Fourth Petition of the Lord's Prayer (and explanation) from Luther's Small Catechism

Guide continues on the back \rightarrow

On January 4th we pray for VISION.

"Pray that the Holy Spirit will again move through the hearts and minds of leaders and pastors that God's vision for His church might be revealed and fulfilled. This is a time of prayer for renewal, revival and encouragement. Pray for God's vision."

Suggested Readings: Jeremiah, 18:1-6; Ephesians 1:15-23; Hebrews 10:23-25; The First, Second, and Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer (and explanations) from Luther's Small Catechism

On each of the three days of prayer, everyone is encouraged to take some time out of their day and pray using the structure above.

On January 3rd, we will be having a prayer service at 7:00 PM at Peace Lutheran to come together as a church family to confess our sins, pray for our needs and the needs of others, and to ask God to give us a vision for the ministry he has in mind for PLC in 2018.
