Next to Holy Scripture, the Apostle’s Creed is arguably one of Christianity’s most important documents. No one is really sure as to when the creed came about, though it is mentioned by name as early as 390 AD. Legend states that each of the twelve Apostles contributed to it, hence the name.

As Lutherans we break it into three sections or articles; one corresponding to each person of the Holy Trinity. Luther placed the Apostle’s Creed second in his Small and Large Catechisms after the Ten Commandments. This was done primarily because the Apostle’s Creed is the good news for those who are convicted by the Ten Commandments (which is all of us). Luther’s explanations of the three articles in the Small Catechism are as rich and beautiful as they are simple. A creed is simply a statement of belief, but the Apostle’s Creed not only helps us to state our beliefs, it also gives us the words to proclaim exactly in whom we put our trust. Luther’s explanations help us to define that trust and faith even further.

Beginning June 16th, the Apostle’s Creed will serve as the outline for my preaching throughout the summer. Because our Narrative Lectionary will resume on September 8th, not every line of the creed will be given a full treatment, but my hope is that by the end of the summer we will all understand this beautiful confession of faith more fully.

The Church Council: May 8th Meeting

- Pastor Sean reported 7 visits with Holy Communion. LCMC Annual Gathering will be Sept. 29 – Oct. 2 in Omaha, NE, and Pastor Sean and Anne are planning to attend. Pastor Sean assisted with Pop-up Perishables on April 17th, and completed pre-marital counseling with one couple. He met with the Community Coordinator for Thrivent.
- Council approved motion to pay in-house pulpit supply \$50.
- Property: Council approved a motion to have the city tar the parking lot. The project regarding the church eaves will begin shortly. The window project for the parsonage will begin soon as well. Council discussed an insurance policy with a different company in which the details are the same or better and the premiums lower. Discussed making some of the pews shorter to allow room for walkers and wheel chairs. Also discussed having some wheelchairs donated or purchased.
- Worship: Live streaming equipment was purchased and the system is working well. New robes are being purchased for the acolytes.
- Education: Discussion on good times to have Confirmation and Adult Bible Study.
- New Business: Unanimously approved motion to accept Justin Martin's bid of \$1300 to mow the church yard and cemeteries'.

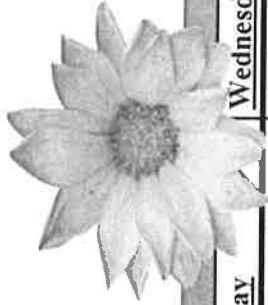
