AM, this means we will only have 8 hours and 36 minutes of daylight on December 21st!

The dark of winter can sure be depressing, which is why Christmas comes at just the right time. Just as the days begin to turn longer Christmas comes with all sorts of declarations of Christ as our light.

Isaiah prophecies, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined." (Isaiah 9:2). From the Gospel of John, instead of the birth story of Christ, John describes the light Isaiah prophesied, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:5). Later in the Gospel Jesus will proclaim flat out, "I am the light of the world." (John 8:12).

Christmas is all about who our hope is in the darkness. The nights may be dark, but the light of Christ fills us and casts away the darkness. At the end of all things, when Christ returns and all the faithful are gathered together under the throne of God, John tells us that the, "night will be no more." He goes on to say that the servants of God will worship the Lord and in so doing, "They will need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever." (Revelation 22:5).

The deep dark of winter reminds us of our own spiritual darkness, but Christmas is God's answer to that darkness. Thanks be to God for the birth of the Messiah, the Light of the World!





Month" was Lutheran Disaster Assistance Fund, and our offerings for that Fund totaled \$485.00. Our November Mission was Cystic Fibrosis of North Dakota, and offerings in memory of Sonia Balliet as of November 21st totaled \$306. Our December Mission is Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch.

Peace Lutheran Church "Mission of the Month" for December is <u>Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch.</u>



Mission Statement: To help at risk children and their families succeed in the name of Christ. Vision Statement: That all children and families achieve greater success in life.

Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch is a Christian ministry that provides a place to heal for children, ages 10-18, who have psychiatric, behavioral, and trauma issues. Children who come to the Ranch have a structured and safe environment in which to live, learn, and heal. They also have 24-hour access to highly trained and qualified staff who provide structure, direction, and modeling--teaching them the skills they need to lead productive and satisfying lives

At the Ranch, children have access to resources they can't get anywhere else. The on-site clinical staff includes therapists, nurses, psychologists, addiction counselors, occupational therapists, and a psychiatrist. They also work with primary medical providers at each location to provide medical care for the children. In addition to prescribed therapy services, children can participate in the Horse Program, a National Youth

Project Using Minibikes (NYPUM), and a greenhouse technology program.

While at the Ranch, children receive a quality education through Dakota Memorial School, the on-campus school that specializes in creating a successful learning environment for children with special psychiatric and behavioral needs. Dakota Memorial School also accepts Day Students, students who live at home but benefit from the smaller classroom sizes and a learning environment focused on their special needs.

Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch is a Recognized Service Organization of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS), an Affiliated Social Ministry Organization of the Evangelical Church in America (ELCA), a Mission Partner of the Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC), and a founding member of Lutheran Services in America (LSA).

Day One: January 4


