Message from Pastor Sean...

John is the perfect Gospel to begin at the dawn of a new year. John's Gospel, as you may know, has no Christmas story (neither does Mark's). Instead, John begins with something often referred to as The Prologue.

The Prologue of John's Gospel begins, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word

was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God." With these words, John begins his Gospel much earlier than Luke, Matthew, or Mark. John begins with the dawn of creation itself and he does so to give us an important theological message about Jesus; Jesus didn't begin at Christmas. In fact, John's message is that Jesus has no beginning at all rather, he was with God in the beginning and "all things were made through him." (John 1:3).

Jesus is the Word through which God brought all things into being. He has always been. John tells us that Christmas is therefore not his beginning. However, at Christmas "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us," (John 1:14) and just as by the Word, God created light (Genesis 1:3), the Word made flesh come to dwell among men is "the light [that] shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:5). John also says this "true light" "enlightens everyone."

John's Gospel doesn't have a traditional Christmas story, instead it begins at the beginning with darkness and with the light-bringing Word. In the dark and cold of January, the beginning of a new year, there is nothing better to receive the Word in whom life resides, through whom we have "the right to become children of God."

Jack Dockter has been approached regarding the basement lighting, and it will be awhile before he can get a bid to us. One of the Sunday School rooms has some loose tiles, and new flooring was discussed. Pastor will have Anne Barnhart and Jen Vetter look at options and get a quote.
- ➤ Worship: No Communion on the 19th Communion on Christmas Day, 10:00 AM Service.
- Education: Sunday School is meeting at 9 AM this month with Christmas Program Practice.
- New Business: The Annual Meeting will be held January 30th after Worship. Will be asking the women of the church to do a Pot Luck meal to follow. Lease for the copier is up, and a motion was approved to upgrade the lease. It was approved to donate \$20 per employee in Chamber Bucks to KEM Electric and MDU, and \$300 to Social Services for the Christmas tree gift tags. Three Days of Prayer January 4-6, 2022

From the LCMC Website: Every congregation, member and pastor is being invited to set aside some time each day of January 4, 5, and 6, 2022 for prayer.

Our attitude toward prayer has often been characterized by saying, "well, all we can do now is pray!" Prayer is not the hopeless act of desperation. Prayer is a gift that God has given to us as a means to approach the throne of grace with confidence—like that of a child coming to her parents sharing concerns, victories, defeats and every part of life. It is an opportunity to express the deepest heartache and the greatest joy. Prayer is a conversation between the Creator and the created...and the conversation began with God, for us, in Christ Jesus.

No matter how you structure this time of prayer, let's come together as an association of congregations across the U.S. and around the world to pray! I believe that the church will never rise up until we first get down on our knees!

Day One: January 4

This is a day focused on **confession**. We have made our lives, our relationships—and even the church—in our own image. We confess that the church belongs to Jesus and not to us. We gather to lay down our pride, our sin and our agenda and ask the Lord of the church for forgiveness, which He gives freely and with mercy.

Day Two: January 5

This is a day of **petition**. Pray for your congregation, for the pastor, for the leaders, for those who carry out ministries, for the Sunday School teachers, for the Confirmation leaders, for those leading adult Bible studies and for those leading small groups. Pray for those in hospital and nursing home ministries. Pray for all those connected to your church that they might know God's redeeming love for all in Christ.

Day Three: January 6

This is a day for **vision**. Pray that the Holy Spirit will again move through the hearts and minds of leaders and pastors that God's vision for His church might be revealed and fulfilled. This is a time of prayer for renewal, revival and encouragement. Pray for God's vision.





A "home away from home"

In July of 1992, the Ronald McDonald House opened its doors in Bismarck - and the community opened its heart - to care for the families of seriously ill children receiving medical treatment in Bismarck and Mandan. More than a place to stay, the House provides comfort and care for families when they need it most.

Ronald McDonald Care Mobile

The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile, a mobile dental clinic on wheels, delivers urgently needed dental care to underserved children ages 0 through 21 in their own neighborhoods in the western half of North Dakota. The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile of North Dakota is owned and operated by Ronald McDonald House Charities of Bismarck. We have partnered with Bridging the Dental Gap, Inc. of Bismarck, a non-profit dental clinic, to establish the Ronald McDonald Care Mobile Program. We strive to deliver our services in an atmosphere of kindness, compassion, caring and respect.

Mobile Dental Program

One of the greatest unmet needs of low-income families is the need for dental care. More than one-half of North Dakota children have had tooth decay and more than one in five children have untreated tooth decay. The existing dental safety net clinics are not able to meet all of the current need in North Dakota. Untreated dental problems can result in pain and infection, create difficulty chewing and eating, and interfere with concentration and learning. The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile is a 40 foot long state of the art mobile dental clinic with its own dentist, dental hygienist and dental assistant. The mobile clinic staff deliver the dental care to underserved children in their own neighborhoods.
