
Every recipe I've tried has had one thing in common; leaven – something to make the dough rise. The leaven may be my sourdough starter, it could be baking soda, and often it is yeast. Whatever the leaven is, it is usually a very small amount compared to the rest of the ingredients. For example, one loaf of bread may have 500+ grams of flour, but only call for 8 grams of yeast. But that little bit of yeast is all it takes to get the dough to rise and grow twice its size.

Jesus and Paul both refer to leaven in their teachings, usually with a negative connotation. In Luke, Jesus tells his disciples to "Beware of the leaven of the Pharisees, which is hypocrisy." (Luke 12:1.) In 1 Corinthians and in Galatians, Paul uses the illustration of leaven to describe how allowing one hard-hearted sinner or just a little bit of false teaching to seep into the church could ruin the entire congregation. "A little leaven leavens the whole lump." (Galatians 5:9.)

Leaven is good for bread, but not for the soul. A little bit of the wrong thing may be all it takes to pull us away from the life we have in Jesus Christ. What little bit of leaven are you allowing into our life? In Jesus' day it was the persuasive word of the Pharisees. For the Galatians in Paul's day, it was teachings that contradicted the gospel. For the Corinthians, it was the influence of a sinner allowed to go unchecked within the church.

Be cautious of anything that contradicts the Word and Gospel of God. Watch out for the sinful influences of friends, family, and neighbors. A little leaven goes a long way.






Thank You!
