Egypt. Pharaoh is paranoid and fearful at how numerous his slaves are becoming so he not only increases the people's workload, but commands that all the Hebrew baby boys be thrown into the Nile! But we read how God *preserved* baby Moses through the faith of his mother who made a waterproof basket in which Moses would float safely away.

In the second lesson, we continued with the story of Moses and God's people with the dramatic crossing of the Red Sea. Here we learned that God is not only powerful, but that he uses his power *to save* his people who were trapped "between a rock and a hard place" (a phrase the kids learned during this lesson.)


For the third story, we looked at the Gospel of Matthew and read about Jesus walking on water. In the passage from Matthew 14, Jesus walks out on the water to meet his disciples who are struggling against a strong wind. Peter tries to walk out to Jesus, but when he takes his eyes off the object of his faith, Peter sinks. In this story we see that Jesus is powerful, like the Father, and like the Father, *he also uses his power to save*.

Of course, VBS is also a time full of games, songs, object lessons, crafts, puppet shows, and a wild group of giggling kids. Thank you to all our volunteers and givers for making VBS a memorable experience!

- Motion was approved to remodel the basement of the church at the \$17,100 quote. Basement flooring: \$12,500; Painting: \$2000, basement, kitchen, going up the stairs; Stairs: \$2,600, from the main entry to the basement. Different color flooring to kitchen, bathrooms, stairs, and classrooms.
- > The Basement Project will start at the beginning of June. Colors are negotiable.

Basement Floor Project

On Tuesday, April 18th, the Church Council had a special meeting to discuss taking care of the basement floors. A quote from Dakota One Coating was accepted to cover the tile in the entire basement with an epoxy fully chipped floor coating and to have the walls painted. The project is set to begin on June 5th and could take about 10 days. After church on Sunday, June 4th, able-bodied members are asked to help clear out the basement for work to begin the next day.



Top 10 reasons to Worship This Summer

#10 To renew our spirits. Other churches are not our competition, it is other summer activities that compete for out time.

#9 Worship is our distinguishing characteristic. The Israelites always gathered for worship. Not attending worship because we are too busy sends a message about our faith.

#8 We teach our children what we value. We are all a member of the Lord's family, children of the same heavenly Father. All children learn from our example.

#7 We're chosen. From the beginning of our lives, we long to be chosen – to belong. The Good News is "While we still were sinners Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8). We were preapproved before we did anything.

#6 We've been created for a holy purpose. "So, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new." (2 Corinthians 5:17) We have been created out of the earth's dust for a holy purpose. It is made clear that the extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. "But this precious treasure—this light and power that now shine within us—is held in a perishable container, that is, in our weak bodies. Everyone can see that the glorious power within must be from God and is not our own." (2 Corinthians 4:7) In worship we draw near to that power, to be forgiven and renewed as God's people.

#5 We have a limited time to worship. Each of us has a certain number of opportunities to worship, so sing the songs of faith and partake in Holy Communion. "I will praise the Lord as long as I live; I will sing praises to my God all my life long." (Psalm 146:2)

#4 To encounter the word. "My warrant is the Word of God-- Naught else is worth believing. Though all my heart should feel condemned for want of some sweet

token, there is One greater than my heart Whose Word cannot be broken. I'll trust in God's unchanging Word till soul and body sever, for, though all things shall pass

way, HIS WORD SHALL STAND FOREVER!" — Martin Luther
