With Christmas behind us, our Narrative Lectionary (the Sunday morning preaching texts) leave the Old Testament and take us into the New. From January to March we will be squarely in the Gospel of Mark.

My favorite Gospel has always been Luke, but Mark would be a close second. As the shortest Gospel, Mark is no nonsense. (Mark

has 16 chapters, Matthew has 28, Luke has 24, and John has 21). When reading Scripture, the words the authors have chosen to use (by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit) all matter, but with words coming at such a premium this is especially the case in Mark.

Some interesting features of Mark's Gospel, besides its brevity, include Mark's emphasis on the humanity of Christ. Mark emphasizes Christ's need to get away for prayer. Christ also shows emotion in Mark like anger, compassion, and frustration. He needs sleep in Mark.


Mark also shows us some thick-headed disciples. They often fail to understand Christ's teachings and have difficulty grasping who Jesus is. It perhaps doesn't help much that Jesus regularly tells benefactors of his works to stay silent and not tell anyone anything. Mark also shows Jesus doing battle with demons more than the other Gospel writers.

Mark is brief and the scenes often change quickly, but there is a lot of gold to gather from this Gospel and I look forward to spending focused time in this Gospel over the next three months.

> Discussion was held regarding Bookkeeper/Secretary position. Decision was made to contact a church member who applied and offer her the position.

Council Meeting of November 30th


- Special meeting was called to discuss Bookkeeper/Secretary position. Position was offered to applicant and was turned down. It was decided to advertise the position on the Church Facebook page, BEK Community Access Channel, and 1 week in the Emmons County Record.
- Discussion was held regarding Bookkeeper/Secretary salary. After the motion was made, seconded, and approved, the salary was increased to \$15 per hour effective immediately.
- It was suggested to acquire an insurance option regarding theft. Will speak with Aaron Stuckle regarding the options.
- A motion was made to take \$15,000 from the checking account and placing it in a 6-month CD at Unison Bank at 5.25%. The motion was seconded, and motion carried.

Council Meeting of December 13th

- Pastor's Report: 5 visits in Nov (3 hospital visits). Burial for Vivian Ketterling Nov. 10. Prayer at Veteran's Supper Nov 11. ECMA Thanksgiving Service Nov 12. Youth Group Nov 15. Thanksgiving Basket Distribution Nov 17. Funeral for Lyla Beitelspacher Nov 20. Began premarital counseling for one couple.
- ➤ Property: Flashing on first post on south side of church was damaged during snow removal. Discussion held regarding the quality of snow removal done. Some issues with where the sidewalk cleaning connects with the parking lot cleaning as well as ice build-up with the recent rain/snow fall. Decided that if there is a considerable amount of snow, it needs to be **

- blown out rather than just pushed with the blade.
- Worship: Communion on Dec 24 (10:45 AM) and Dec 25 (10:00 AM). Worship at 6:00 PM Dec 24 with candles. No Communion on Dec 17 or 31.
- Education: SS Christmas Program on Dec 17 during the church service. Will have practice on Dec 16 @ 9:30 AM.
- Evangelism: Caroling on Dec 10 13 people attended. Planning for a hot cocoa bar after church service on Sunday, Jan 7.
- Endowment: As of 12/11/23 Base: \$57,582.75. Earnings: \$4,182.76. Total \$61,765.51. Joyce has completed a 3-year term and that position needs to be filled at the annual meeting.
- ➤ Old Business: Not a lot of interest in the Bookkeeper/Secretary position.
- New Business: Talked to Insurance Agent regarding theft coverage Employee Dishonesty for Embezzlement. \$10,000 would cost \$86 per year, \$25,000 \$149, \$50,000 \$223. Also, an option to cover "Directors" of the church.



Peace Lutheran Church "Mission of the Month" for January 2024 is Hope Manor / Sober Living



The Hope Manor Foundation is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit corporation providing assistance to men and women who need a structured residential living environment in their recovery from alcoholism and/or addiction. The men and women served by the Hope Manor Foundation are participants of sober living facilities — alcoholics and drug addicts

who exhibit a strong desire for recovery from their crippling addiction.

Hope Manor provides a safe and supportive environment for recovery from alcoholism and/or addiction in Bismarck, ND. While recovery is our top concern, we also want you to be comfortable. Our participants stay in charming, fully-furnished sober living homes that include a variety of amenities.

Hope Manor is open to adults who are seeking recovery. All participants are required to find employment or be enrolled in school. Guests are expected to prepare their own food and pay a \$300 bimonthly participation fee. Program participants must stay for a minimum of three months. We recommend individuals stay for at least nine months to one year since that is where people experience the best results statistically. While recovery can be found through many different pathways, at Hope Manor we utilize one path. We are bound not only in a common problem, but a common solution. Participants attend 12-step meetings, work with sponsors and begin to serve the recovery community. We funnel individuals into 12-step recovery because it is effective and has been for over 85 years, it is free (most of our individuals can't afford the initial participation fee), and it can be found anywhere in the world.
