The Church Council Meeting of March 13, 2024:

- The meeting was called to order by Pres. Elwin Nieuwsma at 7:52 pm.
- Pr. Sean Barnhart opened the meeting with prayer.
- Council members in attendance (Quorum): Tim Dockter, Mark Heidrich, Kevin Hendrickson, Erica Hoff-Wald, Stan Naumann, Elwin Nieuwsma, and Jennifer Vetter. Council member absent from the meeting: Lori Bechtold and Gunnar Hanson
- ➤ Pres. Nieuwsma called for a review of the February 14, 2024 Regular Church Council Meeting Minutes. A motion was made to accept the minutes as presented with no corrections. The motion was seconded. Motion unanimously carried.
- Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Treasurer's Report. A motion was made to accept the Treasurer's Report. The motion was seconded. Motion unanimously carried.

- ➤ Pr. Barnhart presented his report. He started premarital counseling for a couple to be married in September. He started first communion classes with two fifth graders and reported Lent services have been going well. He met with Rick and Barb Bosch about membership. He led the Strasburg Care Center Service and helped with Pop-Up Perishables on February 15, 2024. He led the Caregiver's Connections meeting on February 8, 2024.
- Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Property Committee report. The parking lot tar will come in April. Arrangements will be made to apply it. Mark Heidrich will contact Western Chip Seal for a bid to address the sunken area of the parking lot. The church bells had been chiming on the hour from 9 am to 9 pm with music playing at 9 am, 12 pm, 6 pm, and 9 pm. The church received a concern about the volume and time of the bells and music. The volume was lowered and music will no longer play at 9 pm. Discussion was held regarding the angle of the speakers. The council agreed the black textured tape placed on the top step was effective. It will now be placed on each step. The committee shared a brief conversation about the lighting in the sanctuary, preferred lighting, appearance of light fixtures, etc. The urinal was repaired. The council discussed potential renovations for the basement of the parsonage. Before making plans or pursuing further options for a remodel, the council will seek a professional evaluation of the west wall. A review of the rock strip and landscape options is still pending.
- Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Stewardship Committee report. No Stewardship Committee report.
- > Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Worship Committee report. No Worship Committee report.
- Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Evangelism Committee report. No Evangelism Committee report.
- Pres. Nieuwsma called for Old Business. No Old Business.
- ➢ Pres. Nieuwsma opened the meeting for New Business. A motion was made to approve membership for Rick and Barb Bosch. The motion was seconded. Motion unanimously carried. Pr. Barnhart received a request to place a flat marker on a previously unmarked grave at the Peace Lutheran Church (PLC) Cemetery. The council supported the installation of the marker. Erica Hoff-Wald will gauge interest for a Fourth of July parade float. The Council discussed methods for taking offerings during church services. The Council will seek 2024 mowing bids to include the church grounds, PLC Cemetery, and Bethlehem Cemetery.
- Hearing no further new business, Pres. Nieuwsma called for a motion to adjourn the meeting. A motion was made to adjourn. The motion was seconded. Motion unanimously carried.
- The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.



Volunteers are needed each Sunday.








Quilting will continue in April, and will meet Mondays and Tuesdays from 9 AM – 4 PM
