class now, it seems like there would be no shortage of dramatic historical events on which to report!

As I write this, we are about one week removed from the assassination attempt on Mr. Donald Trump. Like students in high school history, there has been no shortage of interpretations to such a significant event. How should we as Christians interpret this and other dramatic events of our time?

The safest is simply this: repent. Our temptation with current events is to speak prophetically about them, interpreting events as a signs of God's favor or disfavor for our nation or an individual. While there may be truth in such statements, we must be cautious about putting our simple thoughts into the eternally complex mind of God.

But, one thing the prophets did that all of us can do is to call people to repent. All tragedy, all near-misses should remind us of our frailty and mortality as human beings. The current events of the day should sound as a call to self-reflection and self-reflection should always lead us to the same place: I am but a poor sinner who only continues to live and breathe by the grace of God. Every bit of bad news, every national tragedy, every sign of our age that reminds me yet again of the fallen world I live in should send me running to the mercy of Jesus Christ because "there but for the grace of God, go I."

Pray for our nation and the 330 million sinners who call it home. Pray for peace, pray for civility, pray for good governance, but above all, pray for repentance.

A Summary of the Church Council Meeting of July 10, 2024:

The meeting was called to order by Pres. Elwin Nieuwsma at 7:06 pm. Council members in attendance (Quorum): Tim Dockter, Erica Hoff-Wald, Stan Naumann, Elwin Nieuwsma, and Jennifer Vetter Council members absent from the meeting: Lori Bechtold, Gunnar Hanson, Kevin Hendrickson, and Mark Heidrich.

Pr. Barnhart opened with devotions.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for a review of the June 12, 2024 Regular Church Council Meeting Minutes. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as presented with no corrections.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Treasurer's Report. A motion was made and carried to accept the Treasurer's Report.

Pr. Barnhart presented his report. He expressed special thanks to Pastor Sletto and Pastor Johnson for covering services on June 2 and 23, 2024. He did three visits in June and hosted Caregiver's Connections on June 13, 2024. He held a Strasburg Care Center service on June 27, 2024. Season Three of The Chosen is showing on Monday nights. He plans to attend the LCMC Annual Gathering in Marion, Iowa from September 29 - October 2, 2024.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Property Committee report. The block edging around the church has been completed. Plants have been planted and transplanted for the Erin Schmidt Memorial Garden. The gutter and downspouts have been installed. The weeds in the parking lot will be taken care of. The asphalt bid will be tabled until the next meeting. The parking lot tar will be delayed until the fall. The sign has been reinforced, lettering painted black, and step railing has been painted. Spring clean up was tabled with the potential of holding a fall

clean up. Stumps and rocks will need to be removed at the parsonage before proceeding with concrete installation. The council decided to table the two bids for the repair, pending further discussion with the contractors on bid details.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Stewardship Committee report. No report.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Worship Committee report. No report.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Education Committee. The All Sunday School Reunion took an offering for the Sunday School program. Sunday School Superintendents will meet in the next month to prepare for fall.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Evangelism Committee report. The Grill-Out fundraiser on July 5, 2024, as part of the Linton 125th served over 300 people and raised \$2,350.00 for the food pantry.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for Old Business. The Directors and Liability coverage was added to the insurance with a yearly premium increase of \$121.00.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for New Business. Tim Dockter made a motion to approve membership for Bobbi Kramer, from St. Peter and Paul in Strasburg, ND, and Savanna Kramer, from United Church of Christ, Wishek, ND. A moion was made and unanimously carried.

Hearing no further new business, A motion made and carried to adjourn the meeting. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer. The meeting adjourned at 7:52pm. The next meeting is Wednesday, August 14, 2024 at 7:00pm.







the big screen in the sanctuary.




Online Bible Study
