passive thing like something that can't really be helped. It isn't really the fault of the individual leaf. The wind comes, gravity takes effect, and a leaf falls to no fault of its own.

We often call the events of Genesis 3 "the fall." But should we? Adam and Eve "falling" into sin sounds accidental. It sounds passive as though the winds of temptation came along, gravity took effect, and they simply fell. The blame, at least some of it, can be cast upon someone else. In fact, this is exactly what Adam and Eve do. God asks Adam what happened and Adam blames God and Eve, "The woman whom **you gave** to be with me, **she gave** me fruit of the tree, and I ate." (Genesis 3:12, emphasis added). Then Eve does the same thing, "**The serpent** deceived me, and I ate." (Genesis 3:13, emphasis added.)

How we talk about the event of Genesis 3 matters. "The Fall" was not accidental. It was not something that happened to us. Gerhard Forde, a Lutheran theologian, describes "The Fall" differently. He describes it as an Upward Rebellion. It is humanity abandoning their place as creature and trying desperately to usurp God's position as Creator. Genesis 3 isn't accidental. Neither is our own sin. We don't stumble into sin, we choose it.

But fortunately for us, God chooses us. He purposely sends his Son who willfully goes to the cross for us and for our salvation. When it comes to our sin we are the instigators. I alone am responsible for my sin. In fact, Paul in his letter to the Romans would call me an enemy of God (Romans 5:10). But when it comes to our salvation, Christ is the one who does it all and he does it with the utmost intention.

Christ does not pick up the fallen. He redeems and recreates rebellious hearts. In Christ, we rebel scum have been reconciled to God the Father. We are no longer rebellious enemies, but treasured children.

A Summary of the Church Council Meeting of September 11, 2024:

The meeting was called to order by Pres. Nieuwsma at 7:04 pm.

Council members in attendance: Lori Bechtold, Tim Dockter, Mark Heidrich, Kevin Hendrickson, Stan Naumann, Elwin Nieuwsma, and Jennifer Vetter. Council members absent from the meeting: Gunnar Hanson and Erica Hoff-Wald. Pr. Barnhart was holding a confirmation class.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for a review of the August 14, 2024 Regular Church Council Meeting Minutes. A motion was made, seconded and accepted with no corrections.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Treasurer's Report. A motion was made a motion, accepted and unanimously carried, noting Pres. Nieuwsma will speak with someone regarding the date and balance of the CD at Unison Bank (maturity date 8/10/24).

Pres. Nieuwsma presented Pr. Barnhart's report. Pr. Barnhart made a few home visits and a hospital visit. Caregiver's Connections will not continue past September due to low attendance. Mornings at Peace resumed September 11, 2024. Confirmation started August 21, 2024 with nine students. Adult Bible Study resumed with continued study of Revelation. Coming soon: The Second graders receive their bibles September 15; a Baptism is planned September 15; Youth Group (7-12th Grade) begins September 18; Harvest Festival is September 22 with worship at 10:00am; a wedding (Shelby Kelsch and Mark Jochim) is scheduled for Saturday, September 28; a Baptism is planned on October 6; and Confirmation is on October 27, 2024.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Property Committee report. The parking lot gaps will have tar applied once the weather allows for gaps to appear. Sunday School room number one has a small spot bubbling in the new flooring. Pres. Nieuwsma will contact the company that installed the floor for recommendations.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Stewardship Committee report. No report.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Worship Committee report. Pr. Barnhart has been using the monitor to improve the sound in the Sanctuary. Reminder that Pr. Barnhart will be gone September 29, 2024.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Education Committee. Jennifer Vetter shared Sunday School scheduling and curriculum details. Root beer floats were served September 8, 2024 following church service. Mornings at Peace resumed September 11, 2024.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Evangelism Committee report. Endowment report: Base value is \$62,100. Total current value is \$75,413.74. Total earnings are \$13,313.17.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for Old Business. No report.

Pres. Nieuwsma called for New Business. Lisa Ptacek and Deb Jahner are leading Harvest Festival planning. A motion was made to approve the transfer of Kevin Heer from Burlington Lutheran Church in Burlington, WA to Peace Lutheran Church. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously. A motion was made to hold a silent auction during the Harvest Festival for two shortened pews with proceeds going to the Sunday School to use to update Christmas Program costumes. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

The council discussed snow removal for the coming winter months. Council members will seek bids for snow removal.

Hearing no further new business, Pres. Nieuwsma called for a motion to adjourn the meeting. A motion was made and seconded. Motion unanimously carried.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

The meeting adjourned at 7:45pm. The next meeting is Wednesday, October 9, 2024 at 7:00pm.




Adult Bible Study/Online Bible Study


