The Annual Gathering is the main event for our association, the LCMC. Nearly 600 pastors and lay people from around the world gathered for a little bit of business and a whole lot of networking, worship, and preaching.

Part of the business of the Annual Gathering is to hear reports from a few of the association's employees, especially the Service Coordinator, Mark Bradley. You could think of Mark Bradley as the LCMC's bishop if we had one. Traditionally, the Service Coordinator gives something like a "state of the association" talk. In terms of business, a yearly budget is also voted on.

However, the LCMC tries hard not to make business the focus of the Annual Gathering. Keynote speakers, panel discussions, Bible study, and breakout sessions are focal points. Two keynote speakers especially stood out, Kyle Fever and Stephen Witmer. Both spoke on how the Lord uses our weakness and brokenness to do His work in a world that touts strength and power. One breakout that I really enjoyed was led by Pastor Steve Turnbull called, "Gospel Depolarization". In his talk, Turnbull spoke on how the Gospel of Jesus Christ gives what modern politics try to steal from us.

The sessions were all great and edifying, but the primary reason I attended was to continue laying groundwork for the Northern Plains District of the LCMC. Pastor Greg Lontin from Harvey, ND and I were able to meet with about 20 other people from ND, SD, Eastern MN, and Western MT to promote and discuss the formation of a district within the LCMC that would cover our geographical region.

LCMC's vision is that churches would begin to form districts within the LCMC based either on geography or on common mission/purpose. In the United States there are about 800 LCMC congregations which means we are fairly spread out. This makes doing national events, like youth gatherings, more challenging. But if LCMC churches would band together to form districts some things may become easier to do – at least that is the hope with a Northern Plains District. The hope is that this district will be able to provide regional events for youth, women, and men that would be less expensive and more accessible than national events. The hope is also that churches within this district would also be resources for each other in finding pastors and pulpit supply and in doing mission together. As I said, in Iowa, Pastor Greg and I continued down the path of forming this district. Currently, the district is officially Incorporated with an EIN. [Continued on next page \rightarrow]

The next step is to file for at 501(c)3 and to have a Constituting Convention. All of these steps are required by the LCMC in order to officially form a district.

I see this district as something with great potential, especially for smaller congregations like ours that may be a bit secluded from other congregations in our region. The Constituting Convention which would be our first official gathering where our Constitution and Bylaws will be ratified is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, May 10th at Charity Lutheran in Bismarck, ND.
