Have you ever been in a foreign country amongst people that speak a language entirely different than your own? Imagine being in Brazil and you are in the midst of a crisis. You need desperately to express what is going on, so you start speaking Spanish as best you can. Your Spanish is admittedly broken and imperfect, but even so everyone is giving you blank stares. You are

trying to speak the language, but it simply isn't *right*. In this case, it is because the official language of Brazil is Portuguese, not Spanish. You had the wrong language for the situation.

I've noticed that many of us struggle to find the right language in our moments of crisis. (And I should be clear, by "right language" I mean a "Biblical, Christian language.") The response of many of those who vehemently oppose Donald Trump, yet now must live with him as president for the next few years is a good example. Watching Harris supporters utterly lost in tears, completely despondent over her defeat has been surprising. It makes me wonder if many of them do not have the right language for their moment of crisis. What might the right language sound like? Perhaps the simple confession that Jesus is "Lord of Lords and King of Kings," (Revelation 17:14). What greater comfort could there be against all the corruption one might see in government regardless of who is in power?

Funerals are where one's knowledge of the right language is really tested. What language do we fall upon at the death of a friend, relative, or spouse? Is it a favorite poem, a song from the radio, or the declaration that "God's got another angel in heaven?" Some of those things might be great and inspiring, but are they part of the *right* language? (Full disclaimer: we don't become angels in heaven. That is the *wrong* language.)

In our moments of crisis, are we speaking the language of hope and comfort that *only* comes from the one who suffered death himself and then defeated the grave? Uncle John Doe's favorite song may be a classic country hit, but does it speak the language of hope in Jesus Christ? Does it convey the promise that because Uncle John had faith in Jesus we know exactly where he is? Does it remind me that Christ will walk with me in my sorrow? Does it assure me of the hope of the resurrection?

Perhaps this language seems foreign. Learning a foreign language is challenging.

Fortunately, the right language for crisis and for life in general is easy to pick up. We practice and hone it every time we open our Bibles, every time we attend worship, listen in on Bible study, and go to Sunday School. It can be honed further through faithful podcasts, books, and music. Immerse yourself in the right language — the language of Jesus Christ — so that in all moments you will have the right language to speak to yourself and to others.

A Summary of the Church Council Meeting held November 13th, 2024:

Council members in attendance: Lori Bechtold, Tim Dockter, Gunnar Hanson, Mark Heidrich, Kevin Hendrickson, Erica Hoff-Wald, Stan Naumann, Elwin Nieuwsma, and Jennifer Vetter

Pres. Nieuwsma called for the Treasurer's Report. No formal Treasurer Report. Harvest Festival Report: Income \$9,925.50; Expenses \$2,266.38; and After Expenses \$7,659.12. Bank Statements (10/23/24): Money Market \$61,059.46; Checking Account \$48,927.31. Savings account (10/21/24): \$7,291.56. Missions of the Month: (August) God's Child Project \$948.00; (September) Alzheimer's Association MN-ND \$840.00; and (October) Bismarck Cancer Center: \$483.00.

Pr. Barnhart's report: Youth group was held at Pr. Barnhart's home on October 23, 2024 and continues to be well attended. The efforts continue in laying groundwork for an LCMC Northern Plains District. Pr. Barnhart worked with the school and PTO on the My Ascension Suicide Education event. Peace Lutheran Church hosted the movie viewing. The November newsletter was published. The funeral for Bernell Will was held on November 1, 2024.

Property Committee report: Tar was applied to the parking lot. Stan Naumann confirmed Al Hulm will charge between \$50-100, depending on depth, for parking lot snow removal and Craig Brindle will charge \$50 for sidewalk snow removal.

Worship Committee: Christmas worship schedule: Sunday, December 15th, Sunday School Christmas Program (no Holy Communion); Tuesday, December 24th, Christmas Eve Candlelight at 6:00pm with no Holy Communion; Wednesday, December 25th Christmas Day Worship at 10:00am with Holy Communion.

New Business: Kevin Hendrickson made a motion to accept the membership transfer of Arthur (Rick) and Jean Rudy to Trinity Lutheran Church, Mobridge, SD. Tim Dockter seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried. The council reviewed the Use of Church Policies (funerals, weddings, events, etc.). Lori Bechtold made a motion to move the Non-member Use of Church fee to a minimum of \$150 with additional fees at the discretion of the council. Gunnar Hanson seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried.

Terri Fieldsend, Peace Lutheran Church Secretary, tendered her resignation. Kevin Hendrickson motioned to accept the resignation. Lori Bechtold seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried. Kevin Hendrickson motioned to advertise for a part-time church secretary in the church bulletin as vacant until filled. Lori Bechtold seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried.

The meeting adjourned at 7:52pm.


Youth Group Christmas Party! Wednesday, December 18th, 2024

Give Using Tithe.ly






