While preparing for Christmas sermons, I happened upon a quote from W.H. Auden. The quote is really a small excerpt from fairly long poem titled, "For The Time Being: A Christmas Oratorio (1942)". I know poetry isn't always easy to read, but I thought this excerpt to be very fitting for some post-Christmas reflections.

"Well, so that is that. Now we must dismantle the tree,
Putting the decorations back into their cardboard boxes -Some have got broken -- and carrying them up to the attic.
The holly and the mistletoe must be taken down and burnt,
And the children got ready for school. There are enough
Left-overs to do, warmed-up, for the rest of the week -Not that we have much appetite, having drunk such a lot,
Stayed up so late, attempted -- quite unsuccessfully -To love all of our relatives, and in general
Grossly overestimated our powers. Once again
As in previous years we have seen the actual Vision and failed
To do more than entertain it as an agreeable
Possibility, once again we have sent Him away,
Begging though to remain His disobedient servant,
The promising child who cannot keep His word for long."

I am not an expert, but as I read this poem, I am forced to ask the question – does the miracle of Christmas change me? Do I carry the joy and charity of the season with me into January? Or, do I pack them away with the dismantled tree and the boxed up Christmas ornaments? Do I give up on loving "all our relatives" because I have grossly overestimated my powers to do so? Have I merely seen the Vision – that the Lord has taken human flesh and actually become Emmanuel, God with us – but fail to do more than entertain it as a nice idea? Auden would say yes. And as a fellow sinner, I look at myself and I agree with his assessment.

Later, Auden will talk of how Christmas quickly becomes a fading memory and as it does, we just simply go back to our normal lives. Our sinful natures, so often regain the ground they lost at Christmas. We would

rather send the Lord away and simply remain his "disobedient servant, [a] promising child who cannot keep His word for long."

As Christmas fades from memory, "already the mind begins to be vaguely aware off an unpleasant whiff of apprehension at the thought off Lent and Good Friday which cannot, after all, now be very far off."

I'm thankful that it really is only a matter of weeks before Christmas is followed by Lent. We cannot divide the baby in the manger – with all the immediate feelings of joy, gratitude, and brotherly love – from the Suffering Servant who will be bloodied and crucified for joyless, thankless, and hateful sinners like me.

I'm also thankful that we are privileged to tread the same path from Christmas to Lent to Good Friday to Easter every year. I'm thankful that each Sunday we hear echoes of that jpurney through God's Word. And I'm hopeful, that as we continue to hear it the Spirit will continue to chip away at our disobedience to make us faithful servants to The Faithful Servant whose joy and faith will be left to decorate our lives for more than one month a year.



The mission of Farm Rescue is to help family farms and ranches bridge crises so they have an opportunity to continue viable operations. Farm Rescue provides planting, haying, harvesting, commodity hauling and livestock feeding assistance to farm and ranch families that have experienced a major injury, illness or natural disaster. We have assisted more than 1,000 farm and ranch families since our inception in 2005!

We see that one of the biggest financial drains on a family is an unexpected medical injury or illness and, of course, a natural disaster. It is even more pronounced on a farm where a family's livelihood depends on the ability to plant, harvest or provide for their herd.

Farm Rescue gives families a chance to continue their livelihood by providing the necessary equipment and manpower (free of charge) to get the job done.

November 2024 Mission of the Month Giving:

In November we gave \$1,673.00 to Convoy of Hope, an organization bringing much needed help to those areas most effected by Hurricanes Helene and Milton. Thank you for your generous giving!
