structure." This leaves churches within the association to operate on their own. Congregations within the LCMC don't have to worry about an LCMC hierarchy (bishops or presidents) making decisions or social statement that don't jive with their own convictions. Congregations can make their own statements should they choose, regarding social matters. Most congregations choose not to do so, but simply continue to proclaim the Gospel as they see fit. Financially, the LCMC will make appeals, but there is no obligation for congregations to give. If conflict arises or if a congregation finds itself looking for a new pastor, the LCMC has staff to help, provide direction, counsel, and advice, but they will leave final actions and decisions up to the individual congregation.

While there are many positives to such a structure, it is really easy for congregations like ours to feel alone and separate from churches that share our theological convictions. This is where districts of the LCMC come into play.

The purpose of the Northern Plains district will be to provide fellowship, hold events for youth, men, and women, and share resources among congregations from the same geographical area. Included later in this newsletter is a section of the proposed bylaws for the district. This section gets to the heart of the district's purpose and lays out the vision of what the district could be. Please pray, not only for your church, but for the success of this district. The benefits of such a district are potentially great!

# **Church Council Minutes Summary for April 9th, 2025 Meeting**

Council members in attendance: Gunnar Hanson, Mark Heidrich, Kevin Hendrickson, Erica Hoff-Wald, Jason Rossow, Shelley Serr, and Jennifer Vetter. Absent from the meeting: Wayde Bauman and Tim Dockter. **Please Note:** On Sunday, May 18<sup>th</sup> our Sunday worship time will move to 9:30 AM every Sunday. Sunday School and Adult Bible Study will resume in the Fall.

Pastor's report: Pastor did three hospital visits and one home visit this month. Wednesday Lent services and First Communion Education were finished April 9<sup>th</sup>. He plans to make communion bread for Maundy Thursday with the First Communion Education group. He attended the Chamber of Commerce Meeting. Pastor held a few meetings with families and individuals about becoming members, potential baptisms, and weddings.

Property Committee report: After chip sealing, the council will ask the city to paint the curb by the entrances yellow for higher visibility. Lightbulbs will be replaced in the sanctuary. The bubbled spots on the basement floor have been located and marked with blue tape. Loren Hendrickson is working on the peeling sheet metal on the first pillar out the south doors. The council discussed the potential concrete project.

Education Committee report: The last Mornings at Peace (MaP) for the school year was held April 9<sup>th</sup> with 30 kids in attendance. The last day of Sunday School is scheduled for Mother's Day and a brunch is planned for Sunday School families. Vacation Bible School is scheduled May 27-29, 2025.

Old Business: The council discussed and decided to postpone full inside spring clean-up from May until fall. Instead, outside work such as tree trimming, raking, and gutters will be done on May 4<sup>th</sup> after worship.

New Business: Motion to approve new membership for Lyle, Casey, Jacob, Tyler, Thomas, and Nicole VanderVorste; Danielle, Wyatt, Kambree, and Cooper Mastel; and Avis Mickelson. Motion unanimously carried. Sheriff Sanders approached Pr. Barnhart to participate in the North Dakota Crisis Chaplains. The council supported Pr. Barnhart's participation. Saturday, May 10<sup>th</sup> is the LCMC District Meeting at Charity Lutheran Church in Bismarck starting at 10:30am. Motion to donate \$500.00 to the Northern Plains District. Motion unanimously carried. Pr. Barnhart will be away on Sunday, June 22<sup>nd</sup>. The council discussed 2025 lawn care. Motion to approve the bid from Justin Martin for lawn mowing services for the church and two cemeteries. Motion unanimously carried. The council reviewed a letter received related to an increase in insurance premiums. Pres. Hendrickson will contact Aaron Stuckle to ask for more detailed information.

The next meeting is Wednesday, May 14, 2025, at 7pm.



# An Excerpt from the Bylaws of the Northern Plains District:

B3.02 To serve and support the **Northern Plains District** member congregations in their mission to proclaim the gospel, Northern Plains District may, among other things:



- a. Assist its member congregations, where needed, in the process of interviewing and calling pastors to the ministry of Word and Sacrament;
- b. Assist pastors in obtaining calls to ministry of Word and Sacrament;
- c. Assist seminary graduates in the endorsement, call and ordination process of their first call;
- d. Endorse chaplains for specialized services, e.g., military, medical, social services or special ministries of Northern Plains District member congregations;
- e. Plant new mission congregations and support missionary ministries;
- f. Assist individuals in obtaining the proper academic instruction to qualify to receive a call to a Northern Plains District member congregation;
- g. Encourage and support confessional Lutheran seminarians by providing, among other things, mentors and guidance through the seminary process;
- h. Sponsor inspirational and educational gatherings, foster fellowship and worship opportunities;
- i. Strengthen Christ's body on earth by encouraging worship in Northern Plains District member congregations, prayer for one another and study of the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessional writings;
- j. Sponsor youth events that train young people in the beliefs and teachings of our faith, providing guidance and leadership training necessary to raise up a new generation of biblically trained and spiritually grounded Christian leaders; and
- k. Support congregational confirmation and other faith building programs by providing members sound theological resources and training where available.
- 1. Support pastors and congregations in their work through pulpit supply, continuing education, fellowship, and other services as necessary.

#### Mission of the Month: Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch

DBGR helps the most troubled, complicated, and amazing kids by providing best-in-class psychiatric therapy and trauma-informed care.

In addition to Residential Treatment Facilities in Fargo, Bismarck, and Minot, the Ranch provides Outpatient Psychiatric and Psychological Services, and Spiritual Life Programs. The oncampus school, Dakota Memorial School (DMS), provides a personalized education for kids who have psychiatric, behavioral, and trauma issues.

#### **Country of the Month: Germany**

Though it has become much more difficult and more expensive for churches to **go** to other nations, it is still our responsibility and good pleasure to **pray** for the nations around the world. After all, most nations around the world have people of faith living in them. Let us join together to pray for those around the world!

The following information on **Germany** comes from <u>operationworld.com</u>, an organization that helps Christians to know how to pray for the nations.

The decline of Christianity in Germany continues into the 21st century. West Germany was 97% Christian in 1960, but Germany is now less than 53% Christian, and that percentage decreases every year. Church attendance for all denominations is low, and many churches have shut down. Christians divide between Protestants and Catholics, liberals and conservatives, and conservative evangelicals and Pentecostal/charismatic groups. However, we can thank God that this decline has drawn some believers together in new ways. Prayer movements formed and spread, and churches now work together across some cities or regions for evangelism, outreach, and mission.
