Romans 10:17 says, "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." With this verse, Paul sums up a thought about the necessity of the preached Word of God: How can a person call on the name of the Lord and be saved if there isn't a preacher to deliver this word into their ears?

Hearing the **preached** Word of God is incredibly important to Lutheran theology and practice. In fact, the way hearing God's word preached is

described in the Lutheran Confessions describes the preached Word almost like a sacrament. In a document called the Formula of Concord, Lutheran reformers commented on Romans 10:17 saying, "It is God's will that His Word should be heard and that a person's ears should not be closed... with this Word the Holy Spirit is present and opens hearts..." (FC, Ep II 5). Luther, in the Large Catechism (LC V 31) writes, "Although the work is done and the forgiveness of sins is secured by the cross (John 19:30), it cannot come to us in any other way than through the Word. How would we know about it otherwise, that such a thing was accomplished or was to be given to us, unless it were presented by preaching or the oral Word."

God's Word, when faithfully preached, is powerful – not because of the preacher, but because of the Word itself. God's Word isn't just statically informative; it is actively forming. Through the preached Word, faith is born, fostered, nourished, and encouraged.

The church council has decided it is time to update our sound system in the sanctuary, primarily the speakers. I admit, Romans 10:17 didn't come into our conversation regarding the system, but our hearing sure did. The reality is, if a better sound system helps to bring God's Word – whether preached in sermons or proclaimed in song – more easily and effectively from mouth to ear, then I think it's a worthy pursuit. If you would like to give towards this project, please do, but could you also pray? Pray that God would help me to continue to be a mindful and faithful preacher and communicator of God's Holy and Precious Word. Our ears need it.

Church Council Minutes Summary for June 11th, 2025, Meeting

Council members in attendance: Wayde Bauman, Mark Heidrich, Kevin Hendrickson, Erica Hoff-Wald, Jason Rossow, Shelley Serr, and Jennifer Vetter. Members absent from the meeting: Gunnar Hanson.

The Council approved the April and May minutes as well as the April and May Treasurer's Report. Wayde Bauman made a motion to approve the April Treasurer's Report.

Pastor's report: Youth Group was held on May 14 with 25 kids attending. Held a baptism on May 18, delivered quilts to Bismarck, mailed the June newsletter; made two hospital visits and two home visits. Vacation Bible School was held May 27-29 with 35 kids in attendance. The prayer service and funeral for Tim Dockter was held June 8 and 9 respectively.

Property Committee: Mark Heidrich will contact a Jamestown company to discuss repairs to the parking lot.

Evangelism Committee: The Committee plans to do a school supply drive in July.

Old Business: The council discussed the parking lot concrete project and four bids received all with six inch pours and one included a four inch pour option. The council discussed the project and parking needs for the church parking lot. The council decided to table the concrete project for one month; remove the light pole in the parking lot, reconfigure lighting, and closely evaluate parking lot and drive through space.

New Business: The council asked Pr. Barnhart to seek an updated bid for updates to the sound system. Jason Rossow made a motion to begin the process to have two debit cards for the church. Shelley Serr seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried.

Country of the Month: India



In Matthew 28:19, our Lord Jesus said, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations." Though it has become much more difficult and more expensive for churches to **go** to other nations, it is still our responsibility and good pleasure to **pray** for the nations around the world. After all, most nations around the world have people of faith living in them. Let us join together to pray for those around the world!

In 2023, India surpassed China as the world's most populous nation. India is therefore also the world's largest democracy. Political, economic, and social challenges all place a heavy burden on the government. Pray that the government will choose to build on the progress of recent decades, especially to preserve and protect human dignity, rights, and freedoms. The current government has been operating on a Hindutva (Hindu nationalist) platform. This has brought about intensifying persecution of other religions, increasing re-Hinduization/reconversion of Dalit and tribal groups, and the introduction of many barriers of foreign Christian mission in India. The government's aggressive stance to defend Hinduism – and persecute other faiths – has emboldened religious violence by radical Hindu groups.
