- Our Ministry Board has been given the charge to recommend to the Board of Trustees the removal of pastors when necessary. Again, this happens in a direct conversation, by the members of the Ministry Board, and our staff, hoping to restore a pastor while at the same time upholding the integrity of our core values and of our association as a whole.
- Finally, we hope and expect that as pastors and congregations interact, there unfolds a "mutual accountability" that happens on a much more personal level. This is the highest form of accountability—where it is carried out among those who know, love and respect one another.

This core value, in a way, keeps our sinful nature's abuse of the first core value – free in Christ – in check. Our sinful nature always seeks to twist the freedom of the Gospel and aims to enslave us to sin. This is why we need accountability. It is why Paul sent Timothy and others to churches throughout the Greco-Roman world. It is why he wrote letters to those churches. It is also why we are to live lives of repentance.

This is also why the LCMC encourages congregations to join districts – so that those with common interest living in proximity to one another may keep each other accountable. It is also why the Scriptures are so communal in nature. Our faith isn't to be lived in isolation, but amongst others. We need one another for support and accountability.

Church Council Minutes Summary for August 13th, 2025, Meeting

Council members in attendance: Wayde Bauman, Mark Heidrich, Kevin Hendrickson, Erica Hoff-Wald, Edgar Ohlhauser, Jason Rossow, Shelley Serr, and Jennifer Vetter. Absent from the meeting: Gunnar Hanson

Pr. Barnhart's report: attended the LCMC District Coordinator's, Staff, and Board meeting from July 9-11; is doing premarital counseling for two couples; continues to join Global Mission Fellowship and District Coordinator Zoom calls; held a Strasburg Care Center service on July 17; had his first ride along with Deputy Mendoza on August 7; had three visits and one hospital visit; participated in the Day of Caring on August 13; and is preparing for Adult Bible Study, Youth Group, and Confirmation. Northern Plains District info: A website has been put together: northernplainslcmc.com The District Convention will be July 31-August 1, 2026 with a location to be determined.

Property Committee report: Continued discussion on parking lot repair. Discussion about the gutters for the building. The property committee will line and mark the new concrete area of the parking lot and contact the city for availability of concrete parking blocks.

Worship Committee report: Rally Sunday, the first day of Sunday School and Adult Bible Study, is September 7 with Adult Bible Study and Sunday School at 9:30am and Worship at 10:45am. Root beer floats will be served after worship.

Education Committee report: The first Mornings at Peace is scheduled for September 10. Anne Barnhart and Jennifer Vetter met with Pr. Barnhart, reviewed curriculum, set schedule for year, and will reach out to teachers.

Evangelism Committee report: The council held conversation about the Lutheran Church of South Sudan (www.lcss.church), international work happening with the LCMC, and potential future partnerships with international churches. The council held a conversation about needs of the Strasburg Care Center residents. Shelley Serr will contact the women of the church for projects to support the residents. The council discussed the PLC Community Help Fund and supporting members of the church who are in need and/or going through various difficulties. The council will revisit the discussion. It was tabled for discernment and reflection.

Old Business: The AED arrived. The invoice will be coming as well as training to use it.

New Business: A bill was received for additional cemetery mowing services due to weather. Motion to pay unanimously carried. The cemetery needs a site visit to determine needs for controlling lilacs.

The next meeting is Wednesday, September 10, 2025, at 7pm.

Country of the Month: South Sudan



Recently, Pastor Sean heard from two pastors from South Sudan with hearts desperate for the Gospel to impact their country. One of these was Pastor Jordan Long, the leader of the Lutheran Church of South Sudan (LCSS). Pastor Long describes the LCSS as a church in exile. The following information is from the LCSS website (lcss.church).

South Sudan gained its independence from Sudan in 2011 after the deadly and bloody civil war that claimed 2.5 million lives and caused 8 million natives to be displaced. While South Sudan is approximately the size of Texas, it is home to 65 tribes with 65 different languages and continues to be in a state of conflict. Fighting is intermittent but fierce.

Peace is the most indispensable phenomenon the world lacks. Many parts of the world experience wars and violence that result in mass displacement. South Sudan is one of the countries torn apart by cycles of wars. The country has not witnessed the fruits of peace for six decades. The latest civil war erupted on December 15, 2013. The war claimed 20,000 lives in one week and 400,000 more in the last seven years. It displaced 4 million and forced 4 million more to seek refuge in the neighboring countries of Ethiopia, Kenya, Uganda, and Sudan.

The violence then forced the Lutheran Church of South Sudan to relocate its head office from Malakal, South Sudan to Gambella, Ethiopia where it began to shine the light of the gospel on the refugee and the displaced. Many Sudanese refugees fled to neighboring countries and live in communities in Ethiopia, Kenya, and Uganda. LCSS reaches people in many refugee camps and in five different countries.

Please pray for South Sudan: for the LCSS as they minister to the masses who have fled from South Sudan; for those who have stayed in the country to minister to those who live in constant fear and need; and of course for peace from the civil war that plagues the young country.
