

Church Council Meeting Minutes Summary for November 12th, 2025

Council members in attendance: Gunner Hanson, Mark Heidrich, Kevin Hendrickson, Erica Hoff-Wald, Edgar Ohlhauser, Jason Rossow, Shelly Serr, and Jennifer Vetter. Absent was Wayde Bauman

Review of the October 8 Meeting Minutes. Shelly Serr made a motion to approve the minutes. Edgar Ohlhauser seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried.

October Treasurer's Report. Money from the Refinishing Fund (\$25,107.18) was moved to a CD at BNC Bank with 3.8% interest for nine months. The first installment of the Special Assessments for the City of Linton were paid (\$1,837.28 Church, \$918.64 Parsonage). Mark Heidrich made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Edgar Ohlhauser seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried.

Pr. Barnhart's report. Pastor thanked the council and church for their support after the death of his sister. He thanked Pastor Rich for covering the burial for Maggie Bender on October 28. His report included: Wedding for Katie Nieuwsma and Jacob Merck on October 18. Baptism for Evelyn Ferderer on October 19. Youth Group on October 22 (25 kids). Strasburg Care Center Service on October 23. Confirmation Service for Mia Caruso, Skylar Hoff-Wald, Brody Ptacek, Brandon Rossow, Connor Umber, and Nicole Vander Vorste on October 26. Baptism for Graham Kramer on November 2. Baptism for Evelyn Nieuwsma on November 9. Finished Adult Bible Study on Hebrews (studying Lamentations next).

Property Committee: A new oven was ordered for the parsonage. A new sound board was purchased as part of the sound system update. Music stand lights were ordered for the Celebrate. Parking lot curb stakes were installed. The Committee will line and mark the new concrete area of the parking lot. The nursery project is complete, apart from new furniture.

Stewardship Committee: Mark Heidrich made a motion to donate \$500 (from General Fund) to the Emmons County Ministerial Association for Thanksgiving Baskets. Edgar Ohlhauser seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried.

Worship Committee: Pr. Barnhart will use a sermon series from 1517.org for Advent and Christmas Day. New candles were ordered for the Christmas Eve Service. The Christmas Eve Candlelight Service is scheduled for 6:00pm and Christmas Day Worship for 10:00am with Holy Communion.

Education Committee: The Sunday School Christmas Program is scheduled for December 14 during the 10:45 am service.

Evangelism Committee: The Evangelism and Stewardship Committees continue to discuss strategy, opportunities, recommendations, and standards for intentional and wise use of resources, particularly in carrying out the committee missions, the Mission of the Month, and PLC Community Help Fund.

New Business. Gunnar Hanson made a motion to approve the bid for parking lot snow removal from Al Hulm for \$100/hour or \$1.67/minute. Edgar Ohlhauser seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried. Edgar Ohlhauser made a motion to pay the \$100 bill from Bruce Martin for spraying the cemetery. Shelly Serr seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried. A quarter beef was anonymously donated to the church for the Pastor's family. The church paid the processing fee.


Meeting adjourned at 8:22 PM the meeting. The next meeting is Wednesday, December 10, 2025, at 7pm.

Ministry on the Margins is a volunteer-based ecumenical ministry committed to supporting those who fall through the cracks during times of transition. We offer hospitality and coffee, a food pantry, prison-to-society support, an ecumenical Christian worship service, and many other ministries every week.



Ministry on the Margins was founded in 2013 by Sister Kathleen Atkinson, OSB, a sister of Annunciation Monastery in Bismarck. Many compassionate individuals, churches, and organizations helped her. Ministry on the Margins now operates under the guidance of the Benedictine Sisters of Annunciation Monastery.



Country of the Month: Ukraine

Ukraine's location as a gateway between East and West has always left it in a vulnerable position. The Russian invasion of 2022, Russian support of the breakaway republics of Donetsk and Luhansk, the occupation of the Crimea and the Euromaidan of 2014, and the Orange Revolution of 2004-5 all demonstrate Russia's determination to dominate

Ukraine. They also equally demonstrate Ukraine's determination to be free. Millions of Ukrainians have been displaced, and hundreds of thousands have been killed.

Whenever the conflict ends – and on whatever terms it ends – rebuilding from the devastation will take years, or even decades. Even more complicated will be the healing of trauma experienced and, hopefully, an eventual reconciliation with its neighbor. Pray for the intervention of the God who makes wars cease to the ends of the earth and who breaks the bow and shatters the spear (Psalm 46:9). Pray Psalm 10:17-18 over Ukraine – that the Lord would hear the desire of the afflicted, encourage them, and listen to their cries. Pray for wisdom from above, and divine fortitude for Ukraine's leaders and its people.
